ATTRACTIONS ALREADY OPENED

ASIAN ART MUSEUM

- Celebrate the re-opening of over 18,000 pieces of Asian Artwork spanning 6,000 years. Tickets normally are \$15 for adults, \$10 for anyone 13-17 or over 65 and free for anyone 12 and younger. <https://asianart.org/>

AQUARIUM BY THE BAY

- Discover more than 20,000 marine animals living in the heart of Pier 39 at the Aquarium of the Bay. Enjoy interactive tide pools and stunning tunnel exhibits to walk through as you experience the beauty and diversity of Northern California's aquatic life. Tickets are \$29.95 for anyone 13-64, \$19.25 for children 4-12, \$24.45 for anyone 65+, and \$1.00 for children 3 and under. <https://www.aquariumofthebay.org/>

DE YOUNG MUSEUM

- Explore our favorite fine arts museum nestled in the middle of Golden Gate Park, the de Young Museum. Tickets are \$15 for adults, \$12 for 65+, and \$6 for students with a valid ID, and free for anyone 17 and under. <https://deyoung.famsf.org/>

SFMOMA

- The San Francisco Museum of Modern Art welcomes you to come and enjoy the tranquil galleries, airy terraces, kid-friendly spaces, and world-class artwork you love, or visit for the first time and discover something new. Tickets are \$25 for adults, \$22 for Seniors (65 and older), \$19 for young adults (19-24 years old), and free for anyone 18 and younger. <https://www.sfmoma.org/>

ALCATRAZ

- America's most popular National Park and iconic former prison island is open for visitors. Enjoy a 15-minute ferry ride to Alcatraz Island and explore the infamous island. SAN FRANCISCO BAY BOAT TOURS

LEGION OF HONOR

- The Legion of Honor is San Francisco's most beautiful museum. It displays an impressive collection of 4,000 years of ancient and European art in an unforgettable setting overlooking the Golden Gate Bridge. They are open Tuesday-Sunday from 9:30 am to 5:15 pm. Tickets are

CONTEMPORARY JEWISH MUSEUM

- The Contemporary Jewish Museum (The CJM) has distinguished itself as a welcoming place where visitors can connect with one another through dialogue and shared experiences with the arts. CHINESE HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF AMERICA MUSEUM

- The Chinese Historical Society of America Museum is located in the heart of San Francisco's Chinatown. Located in the historic Julia Morgan-designed Chinese YWCA building, the Museum introduces the rich history of the Chinese American experience. Tickets are \$15 for Adults, \$10 for Seniors (age 62+), \$10 for Students (Grades 8-12 and college), and free for children (grades K-&). <https://chsa.org/>

WALT DISNEY FAMILY MUSEUM

- Find animation, innovation, and inspiration in the remarkable life story of Walt Disney, the man who raised animation to an art, tirelessly pursued innovation, and created a distinctly American legacy that transformed the entertainment world. This museum is a nonprofit organization that features contemporary, interactive galleries with state-of-the-art exhibits narrated in Walt's own voice alongside early drawings, cartoons, films, music, a spectacular model of Disneyland, and more. Tickets are \$25 for adults, \$20 for seniors (65+), \$20 for students with a valid ID, \$15 for youth (ages 6-17), and free for those 5 and under and military. <https://www.waltdisney.org/>

EXPLORATORIUM

- The Exploratorium is more than a museum – it's a gateway to exploring science, art, and human perception with every visit. Let your curiosity roam through hundreds of exhibits, many focused on noticing and observation, in six spacious indoor and outdoor galleries. You'll find thoughtful safety protocols, our one-of-a-kind store, dining, and more at our beautiful San Francisco bayside location. Tickets for Daytime admission are \$29.95 for Adults (18-64), \$24.95 for Seniors, People with Disabilities, Teachers, Students, and youth (13-17), \$19.95 for Youth (4-12), and free for children 3 and under. The Exploratorium also offers After Dark Thursday Night tickets for ages 18+ for \$19.95.

GOLDEN GATE PARK

CALIFORNIA ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

- California's Academy of Sciences is happy to announce their reopening on March 17. Come explore world-changing science. They are an aquarium, planetarium, rainforest, and natural history museum in the heart of San Francisco's Golden Gate Park. Daytime Admission passes are \$32.75 for adults, \$25.50 for ages 3-17, \$28.50 for ages 18+ (with student ID), and \$28.50 for seniors 65+ with ID. <https://www.calacademy.org/>

CONSERVATORY OF FLOWERS

- Whether you're a native San Franciscan, a visitor from another side of the world, or a classroom of budding botanists, the Conservatory of Flowers offers an intimate up-close experience with rare and unusual plants unlike any other! STOW LAKE BOATHOUSE

- Come and escape the busy and crowded streets by visiting San Francisco's man-made lake in the heart of Golden Gate Park. Stow Lake offers rowboats, electric boats, and pedal boats to explore the serene waters. Row Boats are \$22.50/hour, pedal boats are \$28.50/hour, and 4-6 passenger pedal boats are \$38.50/hour. <https://stowlakeboathouse.com/>

SF BOTANICAL GARDENS

- San Francisco Botanical Garden are now open seven days a week. Explore 9,000 different plants across 55 acres. San Francisco residents enter for free, otherwise adult rates range from \$9-\$12 and kids \$3-\$7 depending on the day of the week. There is also a Family Rate of \$21 for two adults and all kids under 17. <https://www.sfbg.org/>

JAPANESE TEA GARDENS

- The Japanese Tea Gardens have been mesmerizing visitors to Golden Gate Park since 1894. Enjoy five acres of native Japanese plants, pagodas, stone lanterns, koi ponds, zen garden and a gift shop to commemorate your visit. Tickets are currently \$10 for adults, kids 12-17 will be \$7, anyone 5-11 is \$3 and anyone over 65 pays \$7. <https://www.japaneseteagardensf.com/>

PRESIDIO

CLOSED: Walt Disney Family Museum (WWII Special Exhibition Opens March 19; Main Museum Reopening planned for April)

- The Presidio Golf Course, complete with 18 holes, is nestled into our historic rolling hills covered with Eucalyptus and Pines and open seven days a week from dusk until dawn. OUTDOOR ATTRACTIONS

THE CROOKED STREET

- Enjoy a scenic walk through Chinatown and Little Italy to reach the base of the iconic Crooked Street, a one-block section of Lombard Street with the iconic 8 hairpin turns. Alternatively, you can catch an Uber from the hotel to the top of the street for the breathtaking view at the top of the hill.

PALACE OF FINE ARTS

- The Palace of Fine Arts is a stunning relic from the Panama Pacific Exhibition of 1915 and surrounded by a beautifully manicured lake – a perfect place to enjoy a picnic.

EMBARCADERO

- The historic San Francisco Ferry Building has reopened both indoor merchants and outdoor dining, as well as Farmer's Markets every Tuesday and Saturday. Perfect for a lunch overlooking the Bay Bridge or an afternoon of shopping.

GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE

- Golden Gate Bridge walkways are open to pedestrians and bicyclists. Once you cross the bridge, we always suggest biking the mile downhill or catching a short cab ride to the waterfront town of Sausalito for great waterfront dining and views of the San Francisco skyline!
